

School of Popular Music: Jersey Summer School Permissions and Safety Information (2026)

By booking a place at Summer School, you confirm you are the parent/guardian of the student and you give permission for your child to participate in supervised programme activities, which include rehearsals and group music sessions, performances, and supervised breaks and activities. Jersey Summer School runs Monday 20th July to Friday 24th July and is open to students aged 9 and above.

Public performances

Jersey Summer School includes public busking sessions in St Helier town centre. Students will perform at multiple outdoor locations as part of a structured, supervised programme. Students may be identifiable by image and/or voice during these performances. School of Popular Music cannot control photography or recording by members of the public.

Headline gig: St Helier venue (to be confirmed)

The final performance takes place at a live music venue in St Helier, to be confirmed. The event is supervised by SOPM staff throughout. Students will remain under SOPM supervision at all times. Family and friends are warmly welcome to attend.

Full details including venue, start time, and ticket information will be confirmed closer to the date.

Media and recordings

During the week, students may take part in video interviews, photoshoots, and radio sessions for SOPM content and potentially external broadcasters such as BBC Radio Jersey. Any broadcast or third-party use beyond SOPM's own channels will be communicated to parents in advance. Students will not be named in full without separate permission.

Marketing media (optional)

Separate from the above, School of Popular Music may take photos and videos during the week for marketing purposes (website, social media, print). Surnames are not used without separate permission. Your marketing preference is selected at sign-up and can be updated by contacting SOPM. If "No identifiable marketing use" is selected, SOPM will take reasonable steps to avoid use and to edit where practical.

Medical and emergency information

You are responsible for providing accurate allergy, medical, and additional needs information at sign-up and informing SOPM of any changes before the programme starts. An emergency contact must be available during all programme hours.

Supervision and liability

School of Popular Music will provide appropriate supervision and take reasonable steps to keep all activities safe, including off-site elements. School of Popular Music and its staff are not liable for circumstances outside their reasonable control, except where caused by negligence.
